

MASTER OF DIVINITY

with a concentration in Justice & Peacebuilding

The Master of Divinity is an academic professional degree which prepares students for a variety of ministries. Students may take three years or more to complete this course of study. In partnership with the [Center for Justice and Peacebuilding \(CJP\)](#) at Eastern Mennonite University in Harrisonburg, VA, the Justice & Peacebuilding concentration is designed to help prepare students for work and ministry around the issues of restorative justice, peacebuilding, and conflict transformation. Students must apply to the CJP separately to complete the concentration.
