

MASTER OF THEOLOGICAL STUDIES

The Master of Theological Studies (M.T.S.) provides a survey knowledge of theological disciplines. This degree is intended for persons interested in their own general education, those preparing for teaching or theological research, or those preparing for non-ordained ministry settings. The degree program provides exposure to a broad range of theological disciplines, including required courses in Christian history, ethics, biblical studies, and theology. This program integrates biblical, historical, and theological studies with cultural and social concerns.

Students must complete the following 51 hours (17 courses) to earn a Master of Theological Studies:
